SAVING JAKE: When Addiction Hits Home by D'Anne Burwell

D'Anne Burwell's smart, athletic son—raised in a loving and prosperous home—began abusing OxyContin as a teenager, and within a year had dropped out of college, walked out of rehab, and landed homeless on the streets of Boulder. In *Saving Jake*, Burwell captures the crippling impact of a family disease—a husband's anger, a daughter's depression, an addict's agonizing journey toward recovery. Struggling with fear, guilt, and a desperate need to protect her son, the author discovers the terrifying links between prescription-drug abuse and skyrocketing heroin use, and comes to understand that to save her child she must step back and allow him to fight for his own soul.

Winner of the 2016 Eric Hoffer Book Award for Memoir and the 2015 USA Best Book Award for Addiction & Recovery, *Saving Jake: When Addiction Hits Home* gives voice to the devastation shared by the families of addicts, and provides vital hope. The mother of two young adults, D'Anne Burwell lives with her husband in Silicon Valley.
