## The Benefits of High Quality ECE


More likely to Show improved reading Show improved math Stay in school longer Graduate from high school Graduate from college

# Specific Ask

- Everyone Join the Strong Start coalition, attend meetings, allow us to use your logo, advocate with us – be the "unusual suspects", put ECE on your agendas
- 2. School Districts Grow your TK program, consider extended TK, expand ECE through LCAP/LCFF or with Title I and Title II ESSA funds, enhance after-school and summer programs for low income and young children, reach out to non-profits
- **3. Cities** focus your library and parks & recreation programs on improving early literacy; reach out to school districts and COE for help in improving / coordinating



## **Governor's Budget Proposal**

- 1. No additional funds beyond increases approved in last year's budget
- 2. The preschool block grant proposal:

"Specifically, the Budget proposes a \$1.6 billion early education block grant for local educational agencies that combines Proposition 98 funding from the State Preschool Program, transitional kindergarten, and the Preschool Quality Rating and Improvement System Grant."

California State Preschool - \$845M dollars, 138,400 4 year olds, 300 non-LEAs Transitional Kindergarten - \$726M dollars, 83,000 4 year olds, all E/USDs in CA

Total restructure of CA's preschool system in 5 months led by Governor / DOF

### Feedback to the Proposal

- 1. The early childhood system is too complicated and needs to be simplified
- 2. Greater connection to the k-12 system is very good idea

#### BUT

- 3. This big a change should be part of the policy process and not squeezed into the budget timeline
- 4. We have a mixed model of delivery and should keep it
- 5. What about quality?
- 6. The system desperately needs more money and the budget proposes no additional funding
