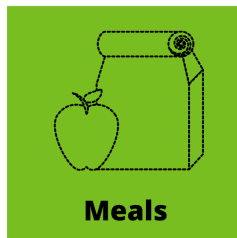


Beyond the Bell

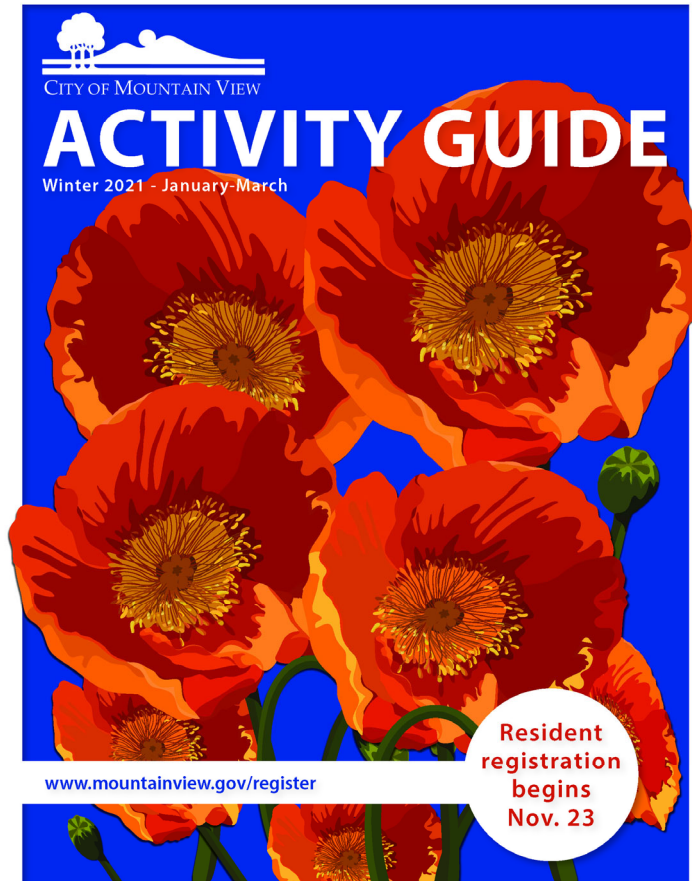


- **Beyond the Bell**

 - ~15 youth participants
 - Four schools involved
 - Limited in-person, distance learning support
- **Summer Nutrition Program**
 - Summer camp participants receive free breakfast and lunch

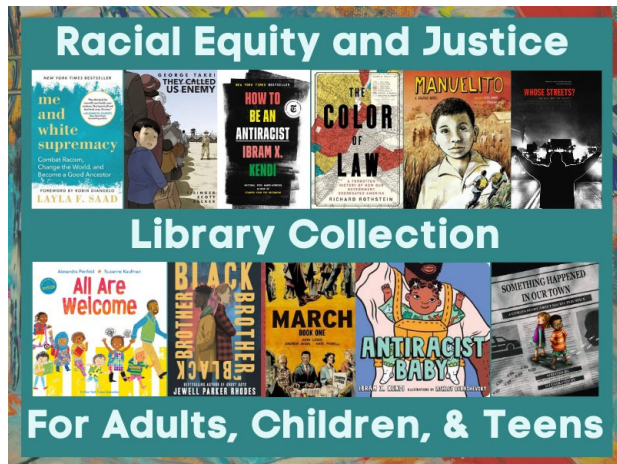
