

Development of Skills, Mindsets, and Habits

Educators emphasize the development of six key competencies: communication, collaboration, citizenship, creatively, character, and critical thinking. These competencies lay the groundwork for success, giving students opportunities to contribute to the common good and tackle tasks that require complex thinking.



Rich Learning Experiences

Students apply the knowledge and skills they are learning by collaborating on rigorous tasks and answering meaningful questions.
