Treatment Team Approach

Working together to stabilize, treat, and find permanency.

Clinicians

Provides therapeutic care, support and treatment.

Builds and facilitates the team based on youths' needs and goals

Makes referrals as needed

Family Specialists

Provides direct support and intervention with youth.

In home, in community, in school support.

Supervision and stabilization as needed.

Family Partners

Support, coaching and training for the recourse parent.

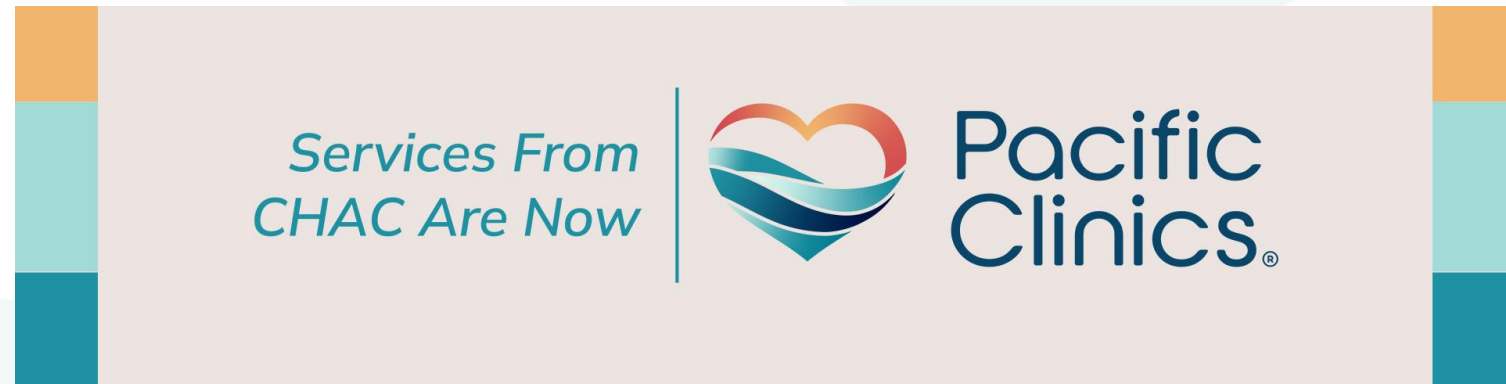
Uses lived experience wisdom to support the team, provide perspective and direction.

Family Search and Engagement Specialists

Builds connections for youth to support permanency plan.

Works with youth to reestablish family relationships that may have dropped.

Services at Pacific Clinics site in Mountain View



- Pacific Clinics is now open and providing services at the former CHAC site at 590 W. El Camino Real in Mountain View.
- CHAC services were a staple of mental health care in Mountain View, Sunnyvale and Los Altos for more than 50 years.
- In keeping with this spirit, Pacific Clinics is providing a variety of services at the 590 site to keep the tradition of providing high-quality mental health care to the community.

Services offered at the 590 site

- 1. Family Resource Center** located at the 590 campus as well as three other sites in Mt. View, Sunnyvale and Cupertino which includes diaper giveaways to the community, workshops for parents and caregivers, support for parents and caregivers, classes and outreach support to the community.
- 2. Outpatient mental health care:** The Pacific Clinics Outpatient Continuum has been accepting referrals to provide outpatient care out of the 590 site. This includes mental health care provided by clinicians as well as doctoral interns.
- 3. School Linked Services (SLS) and Prevention and Early Intervention (PEI) services.** Our SLS and PEI programs are contracted with multiple school districts in the surrounding community and are providing services such as intake appointments for parents and caregivers, therapy appointments before and after school and groups.

Services offered at the 590 site

- 4. The Early Childhood Mental Health Outpatient Continuum** works side by side with families to build positive relationships between young children (birth to age 5) and their caregivers and lay the foundation for healthy social, behavioral, and emotional development.
